The New York Hereford Breeders Ray Russell Memorial Futurity

Overview: Mr. Raymond Russell was a long-time Hereford breeder and enthusiast from Groton, New York. He was very passionate about the Hereford breed, and possessed a strong desire to continually improve his breeding cattle with each and every generation. Mr. Russell believed that the careful analysis of both phenotypic and genotypic characteristics was essential to the improvement of the Hereford breed. Both Ray and his wife Irene found much gratitude and satisfaction in exhibiting their bred and owned cattle at local, regional and State wide shows, and took immense pride in showing the results of their breeding decisions.

Purpose: The purpose of the NYHB Futurity is to create a breeder-friendly competitive exhibition where the breeders can show and display results of their cattle breeding decisions and management practices. The exhibition will integrate both phenotype and genotype in the selection of the annual Ray Russell Memorial Futurity winner. The winner shall receive a financial payment consisting of 90% of the Futurity fund collected. The remaining 10% will be retained by the NYHB to offset the costs of conducting this activity.

Procedures: The basis of the NYHB Futurity is to nominate the planned breeding of any animal <u>before</u> it is born. The breeder, or owner of the nominated pregnancy will then have several opportunities to keep their animal involved with the competition by submitting the outlined information and financial payment by the due dates specified in the rules section of this document.

Theses are the three "stages" of Futurity involvement. These Stages are:

- **Stage 1** Pregnancy nomination. Submit proof of dam ownership, breeding information, and \$10.00 nomination fee.
- **Stage 2** Calf verification. Submit calf registration number issued by AHA, and parent verification resulting from DNA submission to the AHA, and \$20.00 stage fee.
- **Stage 3** Yearling Activation submit THR performance information, including weaning weight, yearling weight, performance ratios and \$20.00 stage fee.

Exhibitors of the nominated pregnancy will then have up to two opportunities to exhibit their Futurity nominations. Nominations may be show as calves, and may also be show as yearlings, as long as the necessary requirements of involvement are met.

There will be two divisions of competition which will be heifers and bulls.

Rules and General Procedures

- 1. You must be a member in good standing of the NYHB or NYJHB, as well as the AHA or AJHA to enter and to participate.
- 2. The dam must be owned by you, and/or immediate family members at the time of breeding.
- 3. Embryo Transfer (ET) calves are eligible, as long as the donor dam is owned by you, and/or immediate family members at the time of embryo recovery.
- 4. All nomination fees and stage fees are non-refundable.
- 5. Nominations are transferable. If you sell a bred female and the mating was nominated, or if you sell a nominated calf, the new owner may continue with the process by paying any remaining fees as they come due. If you sell a nominated animal, be sure to send the "new owner" information to the NYHB.
- 6. Prior to showring competition, all entries will need to be parent-verified through the AHA DNA testing procedure.
- 7. EPD's and related performance indices generated by the AHA will be provided to the judge(s) prior to the beginning of the show. The judge(s) will be allowed to use this information at their own discretion.
- 8. The annual NHYB Futurity Show will be held at the New York State Fair at the conclusion of the New York Junior Hereford Breeders Show, or will be determined by the Beef Show Superintendent. All rules and procedures for beef cattle exhibition set forth by the NY State Fair must be followed.
- 9. The financial award being payed out to the winner will be based on the number of female entries for the heifer division, and the number of male entries for the bull division.
- The Futurity Committee shall ensure that all rules are being followed and shall be responsible for maintaining and for providing accurate records for involvement.

Fee and Nomination Schedule

- 1. Spring-born calves (January July)
 - a. Pregnancy nominations are due on or before January 1st, accompanied by the \$10.00 nomination fee.
 - b. Calf Verifications are due by **July 15**th if showing calf in competition. Otherwise, calf verification is due **December 15**th, accompanied by \$20.00 activation fee.
 - c. Yearling Activation due July 15th, accompanied by \$20.00 activation fee.
- 2. For Fall-born calves (August December)
 - a. Pregnancy nominations are due on or before July 15th accompanied by the \$20.00 nomination fee.
 - b. Calf Verification and Yearling Activation are due July $15^{\rm th}$ of the subsequent years following the birth. Activation fees are also due on this date.

NEW YORK HEREFORD BREEDERS Constitution and By-Laws

Article I - Name

The name of the Association shall be the NEW YORK HEREFORD BREEDERS, INC. (NYHB). This Association shall be a not-for-profit corporation and shall be associated with the national breed registries.

Article II - Objectives

The objectives of the Association shall be to advance the interests of Hereford breeder members in New York and surrounding areas; to help establish new breeders; to promote New York as a source of genetically valuable seed stock; to assist members in developing public and private treaty marketing alternatives for quality seed stock; to help educate members in husbandry and marketing practices by collecting and disseminating information and materials and conducting public activities; to communicate with members and those interested in Herefords through correspondence, newsletters, and other means; to conduct field days, to do any and all things necessary to advance the genetic breeding values of Herefords and the interests of Association members.

Article III - Membership

Section I – Any person of firm engaged or interested in rearing, feeding, and managing Hereford cattle in the United States and Canada is eligible to become a member upon payment of a membership fee. Upon receipt and approval of the application and acceptance of the appropriate fee by the NYHB, the applicant shall be deemed a member. Membership fee: \$30.00 a year paid during current year; \$50.00 for two years, available only of Directory year, due and payable before January 31st of Directory year. In order to be listed in the Directory, \$50.00 dues must be paid. This membership is not transferable or refundable.

Section II – Each voting membership shall be entitled to one (1) vote per member in attendance at meetings. Two (2) votes per farm or household will be permitted where multiple memberships are held by the farm or household.

Section III – Membership is active only as long as dues are current. Members terminated for non-payment may be reinstated by paying delinquent dues plus current year's dues.

Section IV – Voting memberships may also be suspended indefinitely for a firm or individual for actions deemed not in the best interests of the Association. Cause for such action must be presented in writing to the Association Secretary by a member of the Association. The member against whom the allegations are made shall receive written notice of all of these from the Secretary within fifteen (15) days of their receipt by certified mail. The member shall have thirty (30) days in which to respond in writing to the Secretary about the allegations. The Executive committee shall review the allegations and member response and decide by majority vote whether to bring the issue of member suspension before a general membership meeting. After a reasonable length of time for a debate of the issue, members present at a general membership meeting may by 2/3 majority vote suspend the member if just cause for suspension is proven in the allegation(s).

Section V – Reinstatement of a suspended member shall likewise require a 2/3 majority vote by voting members present at a general membership meeting.

Section VI – <u>Honorary Memberships</u> may be granted by the Association by a 3/4 vote of those present at the annual meeting. Nominations must be made at an Association meeting prior to the annual meeting and included in the annual meeting agenda.

Section VII – Affiliate Memberships may be granted to firms, households, and individuals interested in Herefords upon payment of a ten dollar (\$10.00) annual membership fee. Affiliate members will have full privileges within the Association with the exceptions of voting and consigning registered breeding animals to Association sales.

Section VIII – Life Memberships – Upon formation of the Association, certain of the previous NYS Hereford Associations were granted Life Memberships. Those members who have Life Membership shall be transferred to the NYHB as life members if they request to be transferred. A fee of \$50.00 per existing Life Membership transferred shall be paid by the member's current Association to the NYHB up to the limit of the current Association's assets.

Section IX – Junior Members – Any individual under 21 years of age who is interested in Hereford cattle may become a member of the New York Junior Hereford Association. Such membership shall carry no voting rights to NYHB. Juniors members must belong to at least one of the National Hereford Associations.

Article IV - Officers

Section I – The officers of this Association shall be the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Section II – The officers and committee chairpersons will be elected by the majority of the general membership in attendance at the annual meeting. The nominating committee shall consist of the chairperson and four other members. The chairperson shall be elected at the annual meeting by the membership. The President shall appoint one member , the Vice-President one and the chairperson two members. The nominating committee shall present a slate officers including President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and committee chairpersons at a membership meeting or by mail to each member at least 30 days prior to the annual meeting. The positions of Treasurer and Secretary may be combined if the need arrises, with one officer doing both duties. In addition, there may be nominations from the floor.

Section III – Terms of office shall be for one year and limited to two (2) consecutive terms, with the exception of the Secretary and Treasurer.

Section IV - Duties of the officers are as follow:

<u>President</u> – It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all regular and special meetings of the Association and to appoint all committees unless otherwise provided for and shall maintain a general oversight over the affairs of the Association. The President may call a special meeting at any time upon ten days written notice being given.

<u>Vice-President</u> – It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to act in the absence of the President.

Secretary – It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a record of the proceedings of the Association in a book furnished for that purpose, which shall be the property of the Association, and shall attend to the correspondence and general business of the Association, including membership. He, or she, shall be under direct order pf the President and at the annual meeting of the Association shall make a full report of all business for the previous fiscal year and do and perform such other duties as may be required of him or her. He, or she, will be responsible for maintaining and updated membership list, dues, notices, and soliciting new members, with the assistance of the membership committee.

Treasurer – It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all money paid the Association, issuing a proper receipt therefore; to pay all bills and make full and detailed report at the annual meeting of all money received and paid out for the preceding

year. The treasurer shall act as sales clerk and shall be bondable.

<u>Executive Committee</u> – The President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and immediate past President, as ex-officio member, shall act as an Executive Committee and shall have authority to transact all business for the Association subject to the direction of members.

Article V – Meetings

Section I - The Annual Meeting shall be held during the last quarter of the calendar year.

Section II – There shall be no less than three (3) meetings per year, plus the Annual Meeting with dates to be determined at the end of the preceding meeting.

Section III – There shall be not less that ten (10) days written notice of all meetings.

Section IV – Upon written petition of ten (10) members to the President, with a copy to the Secretary, a special meeting may be called of the Association.

Article VI - Committees

Section I – <u>Committees</u> shall be selected as indicated below by Presidential appointment. **Section II** – The <u>newsletter editor</u> shall be selected by a membership vote, with the official ownership of said newsletter to remain with the Association.

Section III - Standing Committees will consist of three, five or seven members including the chairperson. The size of each committee shall be determined by the President. The chairperson will be elected at the Annual Meeting by a majority of the members present. The remaining standing committee members will be appointed by the President, Vice-President and the committee chairperson. Each committee will elect a vie chairperson, and will submit a written report prior to the Annual Meeting.

Section IV – The President shall appoint a member of the New York Bull Test and a member of the State Fair Board and two alternates for each position.

Article VII - Indemnification

The Association shall indemnify (a) any person made of threatened to be made a party to any action or proceeding by reason of the fact that such person, such person's testator or interstate, is or was an officer of the Association and (b) and office of the Association who served in the capacity at the request of the Association, in the manner and to the maximum extent permitted by the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law of New York, as amended from time to time; and the Association may in the discretion of the officers indemnify all other members to the extent permitted by law.

Article VIII - Headquarters

The principal place of business of the Association shall be the home or office of the Secretary.

Article IX – Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order, Revised* shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-laws.

Article X – Amendments

Amendments may be made at the Annual Meeting by two-thirds majority vote of attending members. Discussion is required to have taken place at a previous meeting and the minutes of same distributed to all members a minimum of ten (10) days prior to the Annual Meeting.

Article XI - Dissolution

In the event that it becomes necessary to disband the Association, the Treasurer, after all bills have been paid, will turn over all remaining funds to a recognized charity or charities or the American Hereford Association (AHA), to be designated by the current membership, so long as such organization shall qualify under Section 501 © of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended

Article XII - Finances

Any motion that is put forth, seconded, and passed by the general membership and requires an expenditure of more that five hundred dollars (\$500.00), must also be passed by a three-fifths majority vote of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee has ten (10) business days to make its vote. If the motion does not pass the Executive Committee, the motion will be tabled until the next regular meeting of the Association, at which time it may be reintroduced as a new motion with new discussion and voting.


